Clinical Audit Workshops – Hand Hygiene and Waste Management

The IDA's Quality and Patient Safety Committee will once again hold clinical audit workshops, adding to the existing range of audit tools available on the members' section of the website.

Hand hygiene

In the battle against infection, hand hygiene is proven to be the single most important factor. It is internationally recognised as a most important preventive measure in infection prevention and control (HIQA, 2007). Hand hygiene is a primary disease prevention





measure for healthcare workers (Dental Council, 2006). Hand hygiene is the responsibility of all individuals involved in the provision of dental care in order to minimise the risk of infection. Raising awareness among staff and patients is a vital factor in ensuring compliance. Waste management

Dental surgeries in Ireland are now subject to inspection by the Health and Safety Authority (HSA) to check for correct segregation, packaging and disposal of clinical waste, such as sharps, swabs and other contaminated items, liquid x-ray solutions if in use, and proper storage and



disposal/recovery of waste amalgam. Dental practices must have robust waste management processes in place to ensure compliance, best practice and quality systems for the correct segregation, packaging, transport and disposal/recovery of dental clinical waste streams.

Clinical audit workshops to promote awareness and ensure compliance in hand hygiene and waste management will take place on Friday and Saturday. Practical advice and simple audit tools/check sheets will be demonstrated. All members of the dental team are encouraged to attend. We look forward to seeing you at the workshops.
