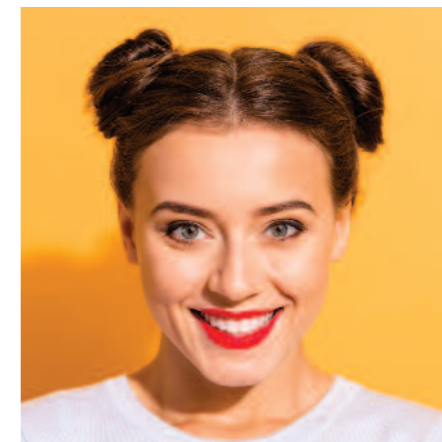

# SPEAKERS



## **Dr Richard Balmer**

Richard is a specialist paediatric dentist and Honorary Consultant/Lecturer at Leeds Dental Institute. His research interests include enamel defects and child protection. He is co-author of the British Society of Paediatric Dentistry guidelines for dental neglect and is a certified national trainer for the Advanced Life Support Group on Recognition and Response in Child Protection.



## **Dr Andrew Bolas**

Andrew received his BDA from Queen's University Belfast in 1991, his FFD(RCSI) in oral surgery in 1994, and his FDSRCS(Ed) in oral surgery and oral medicine in 1995. He went on to receive his MSc in dental radiology. He works as a dental advisor to the National Radiation Safety Committee and Medical Exposures Radiation Unit of the HSE and was the President of the IDA in 2012.



## **Dr Alison Dougall**

Alison is a Consultant for Medically Complex Patients and President Elect of the International Society for Disability and Oral Health. She underwent training in special care dentistry at the Eastman Dental Institute and has been a long-time advocate of reducing inequalities in oral health. In 2006, she was voted the health leader of Ireland for her work designing integrated oral healthcare pathways for people with bleeding disorders.



## **Dr Martin Foster**

Martin has experience in a wide range of settings, including care for maximum security psychiatric patients, sedation and anaesthetic referral services, and clinical tutoring in paediatric dentistry. He is the DPL lead for Ireland, is a regular presenter on a range of issues, and has a particular interest in communication and risk management. He maintains a weekly clinical commitment as a specialist in paediatric dentistry.



## **Dr Niamh Galvin**

Niamh holds the position of Assistant National Oral Health Lead in Quality and Risk. She qualified in Cork in 1982 and spent a number of years in general practice before moving to the public service. She was one of the first dentists to obtain a first-class master's degree in healthcare infection management (TCD), and also holds an FFD(RCS) in community dentistry.



## **Ms Mary Godfrey**

Mary is a Clinical Risk Adviser at the State Claims Agency, providing risk management advice to health services and education programmes in the health and education sectors. Her experience also includes developing national policy and professional guidance, auditing and monitoring regulatory standards, quality and risk management, research ethics, and governance.



## **Dr Dympna Kavanagh**

Dympna is Chief Dental Officer at the Department of Health. A graduate of University College Cork Dental School, with a PhD in Preventive Dentistry, Dympna has worked in the NHS and in the Irish health service. She completed her higher training in Dental Public Health in Guy's Hospital, King's College, London.



## **Dr Rona Leith**

Rona completed her doctorate in paediatric dentistry in the Dublin Dental University Hospital and thereafter the FFD from the RCSI. She is past president of the Irish Society of Dentistry for Children and is currently president of the Irish Division of the European Academy of Paediatric Dentistry. She works as Assistant Professor in Paediatric Dentistry in the Dublin Dental University Hospital.



## **Dr Tim McSwiney**

Tim graduated in 2006 and underwent specialist training in orthodontics at Cork University Dental School and Hospital. He was awarded a doctorate in orthodontics in 2012 and a membership of orthodontics from the Royal College of Surgeons in Edinburgh. He is a Consultant Orthodontist at St James's Hospital, Dublin, where he is involved in the management of patients with cleft lip and plate and complex craniofacial anomalies.



## **Dr Jennifer Parry**

Jennifer graduated from UCC and completed a master's in paediatric dentistry at the University of Leeds. She completed her paediatric dentistry specialty training at the Eastman Dental Institute, and King's and Guy's Hospitals in London. She is a regional representative for charity Dental Trauma UK. She has held multiple consultant posts in paediatric dentistry and was appointed Consultant/Senior Lecturer at UCC in January.



## **Prof. Wendy Turner**

Wendy graduated from the London Hospital Medical College in 1992 and then worked for 25 years at Barts and The London School of Medicine and Dentistry before moving to Queen's University Belfast in 2018.
