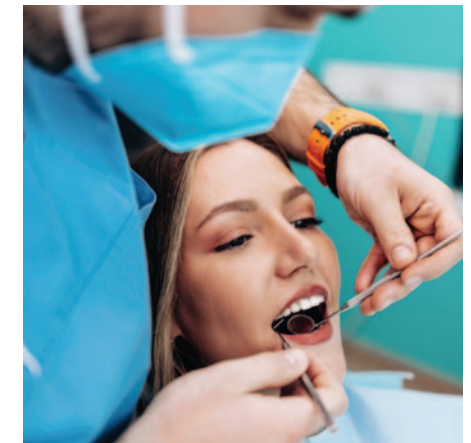

Dr Dympna Kavanagh
Opening address

Dympna is Chief Dental Officer at the Department of Health. A graduate of University College Cork Dental School, with a PhD in Preventive Dentistry, Dympna has worked in the NHS and in the Irish health service. She completed her higher training in Dental Public Health in Guy's Hospital, King's College, London.



Dr Noel Kavanagh
Avoiding burnout

Noel is a Senior Dental Educator in Dental Protection's Risk Prevention team, supporting the development and delivery of risk prevention material to members worldwide. He is an international dental speaker and published author on various Risk Prevention topics. He develops and delivers dental podcasts and webinars, and is an accredited facilitator of both virtual and face-to-face workshops.



Dr Rona Leith
Minimal intervention for caries management in primary teeth

Rona is Assistant Professor in Paediatric Dentistry at the Dublin Dental University Hospital, where she manages the undergraduate paediatric dentistry programme and is involved in all aspects of postgraduate clinical, didactic and research activities. She is past president of the Irish Society of Dentistry for Children and the Irish Division of the European Academy of Paediatric Dentistry.



Dr Niamh Galvin
IPC and dental unit waterlines

Niamh is Assistant National Oral Health lead (Quality and Risk) in the National Oral Health Office. She qualified in Cork in 1982 with an honours degree and spent a number of years in general practice before moving to the public dental service. She holds a Fellowship in Community Dentistry from RCSI, as well as a first-class Master's in Management of Healthcare Infections from TCD.



Dr Andrew Bolas
"Love is all around" - why do dentists like panoramics and cone beams

Andrew received his BDA from Queen's University in 1991, his FFDRCSI in oral surgery in 1994 and his FDSRCS(Ed) in oral surgery and oral medicine in 1995. He then went on to receive his MSc dental radiology in 2000. Andrew works as a dental advisor to the National Radiation Safety Committee and Medical Exposures Radiation Unit of the HSE, and was the President of the IDA in 2012.



Prof Anne O'Connell
Traumatic injuries- What do I do next ?

Anne is Professor in Paediatric Dentistry and Consultant in the DDUH and CHI, Tallaght. She completed undergraduate training in Dublin and specialty training at the Eastman Dental Center, USA. She is the President of the International Association of Dental Traumatology, and serves as the International Consultant on Scientific Committee of the American Academy of Paediatric Dentistry.



Prof. Siobhan Barry
Managing the high caries risk paediatric dental patient.

Siobhan graduated from University College Cork in 2001 and completed specialty training in paediatric dentistry at the Leeds Dental Institute. She was appointed as consultant in paediatric dentistry at the University Dental Hospital of Manchester in 2014. She is the academic lead for undergraduate paediatric dentistry and programme director for the MClInDent masters programme.



Dr Shane Higgins
Managing the mixed dentition – orthodontic problems and solutions

Shane qualified in dentistry from TCD in 2006. After a number of community and hospital dental posts in Ireland and the UK, including four years as a general dental surgeon in Longford/Westmeath, he completed specialist training in orthodontics at Birmingham Dental Hospital in 2016. He is a full-time Consultant Orthodontist at Birmingham Dental Hospital and Honorary Clinical Lecturer in Orthodontics at the University of Birmingham.



Dr Eleanor McGovern
Dental care for children with complex medical needs

Eleanor qualified as a dentist from the University of Sheffield in 1999. She worked within hospital dental services, and general dental practice in the UK, Ireland and Australia, and completed specialist training in paediatric dentistry at Trinity College Dublin. She has a special interest in the provision of dental care for children with cleft lip and palate, craniofacial syndromes and for children with complex medical needs.



Dr Vicki Jones
Oral health and dementia friendly dental

Vicki currently works as a consultant in special care dentistry and Clinical Director of the Community Dental Service for Aneurin Bevan University Health Board in Wales, and is lead clinician for older frail and vulnerable adults and people with a mental illness. She has been the honorary secretary and past president of the British Society of Gerodontology (BSG), which is a charity that promotes oral healthcare for older people.



Dr Brian McClean
Emotional resilience

Brian McClean qualified as a Clinical Psychologist from the University of Surrey in 1987. He is currently Principal Clinical Psychologist with Acquired Brain Injury Ireland, where he provides Cognitive Behaviour Therapy, Compassion Focused Therapy and Mindfulness Based Cognitive Therapy.



Dr Dermot Murnane
Basic oral surgery tips

Dr Dermot Murnane qualified as a dentist in 1992 and started working in Oral and Facial Surgery in 1995 in the UK. Returning to Ireland in 2001, completing a masters in Oral Surgery in 2004.
