



Modern medicine for a modern patient

Obesity – a pandemic in slow motion.

This talk will focus on how our understanding of obesity has moved on and how much better we understand how the body regulates weight. We now know that for 90% of people weight gain is 90% irreversible. Adipose tissue thermogenesis regulates this process and is influenced by medication – contributing to medication-induced weight gain. Understanding this interaction between medication and weight helps with empathy in raising the issue of weight and allows a positive start to address weight reduction.

NCEC Guideline 30 – infection prevention and control

The Department of Health has published a National Clinical Effectiveness Committee (NCEC) guideline on infection prevention and control. This is a comprehensive document that is intended to support all healthcare service providers in Ireland.
