Dr. Noel Kavanagh qualified from the Dublin Dental Hospital in 1995 and he then worked as both an associate & principal dentist in the UK before returning to Ireland in 2000. He then bought and ran a general dental practice in Kilkenny City for 19 years. Dr. Kavanagh is a member of the IDA & has served as a GDP representative & on the Quality & Patient Safety Committee. He completed post graduate studies at the UCD School of Medicine in 2019 in Risk Management, Quality and Medico Legal Aspects of Health Care. More recently, Dr. Kavanagh took up a full time role with Dental Protection in 2019 as their Education & Engagement Lead for Ireland.



Kathryn Harley studied dentistry at Guy's Hospital Dental School, London from which she graduated in 1981. She completed a Masters degree in Conservative Dentistry at the Eastman Dental Institute in 1986 and following specialist training in Paediatric Dentistry was appointed Consultant and Honorary Senior Lecturer in Paediatric Dentistry at the Eastman in 1991. Her main area of clinical interest dating from this time is in the restorative treatment of dental anomalies. She became consultant in Paediatric Dentistry in Edinburgh at the Dental Institute where she was Head of Department 1999 until 2011 when she became Dean of the Faculty of Dental Surgery of the Royal College of Surgeons of England. Kathryn has also been actively involved in dento-legal work through her involvement with Medical Protection. In 2010, she completed ten years as a member of the Board of Dental Protection Limited (DPL), having been Chairman from 2006. In this capacity she sat on the Council of Medical Protection. Kathryn returned to London in January 2015 as a part-time Consultant in Paediatric Dentistry at the Eastman Dental Hospital and in March 2018 she moved from the Eastman to join the Paediatric Dental team at Great Ormond Street Hospital and she also spends two sessions per week in private practice working in this capacity in both London and Edinburgh where her family home is based.



Fintan Hourihan is chief executive of the Irish Dental Association, a position he has held since 2008. Fintan is responsible for all aspects of the Association's operations and is particularly focussed on representing dentists holding state contracts or employed in the public service as well as public affairs and advocacy on behalf of dentistry.

He has over 25 years' experience in all aspects of collective bargaining and negotiations, having previously served as Director of Industrial Relations with the Irish Medical Organisation and as a senior official with the ASTI which represents secondary teachers. An accredited mediator, he has published extensively and engaged in media and advocacy on behalf of members over many years. He is currently chair of the Irish Inter-Professional Association, a network of leaders from professional bodies in the health, financial, engineering, property and accountancy professions. Fintan is a graduate of the University of Limerick and University College Dublin.



Richard Ibbetson graduated from Guy's Hospital in 1974 and spent nearly two years in general practice in Devon before leaving the UK to work in Canada as a dentist for the Grenfell Association in Newfoundland and Labrador. He returned to the UK in 1978 to take an MSc at the Eastman Dental Institute in London where he then spent 20 years on the staff as a teacher of conservative dentistry and fixed prosthodontics. In 1999 he was appointed Professor and Director of the Postgraduate Institute at the University of Edinburgh. From 2011-14, he was Dean of the Faculty of Dental Surgery of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh whilst also holding a Chair in Restorative Dentistry at QMUL in London. He then spent a short period of time at UCLAN before taking up the post of Director of Dentistry at the University of Aberdeen in 2015 from which he stepped down in late 2018. He remains a Professor in Restorative Dentistry at Aberdeen and teaches both undergraduates and postgraduates.
