Prof. Conor Barry



Oral and maxillofacial update for the high street dentist

Conor qualified in dentistry (2001) and medicine (2006) from Trinity College Dublin. After basic surgical training in St James's Hospital, he undertook higher surgical training in Liverpool, UK. He finished his training with a fellowship in head and neck cancer surgery in Birmingham and a further fellowship in reconstructive surgery at the Sydney Head and Neck Cancer Institute in Australia. He was appointed as a consultant in St James's Hospital in 2015 and moved to Cork as Associate Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery in 2020.

Dr Mairéad Browne



Medical aesthetics: Botulinum Toxin type A uses

Mairéad graduated with an honours degree in dentistry from University College Cork in 2006. She continued her postgraduate training and took a position as a Senior House Officer in the Cork University Dental Hospital and was awarded membership of the Faculty of Dentistry in the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland in 2008. She is a past president of the Southern Regional Committee and is a member of the Irish Dental Association council and GP committee. She has a special interest in facial aesthetics and has been practising in the area for 12 years. She has completed numerous advanced anti-wrinkle and filler training courses with Dr Mauricio Di Maio, Dr Raj Acquilla and Dr Bob Khanna. She is a member of the American Academy of Aesthetic Medicine and Save Face. She obtained her master's in aesthetic medicine in 2019 from Queen Mary University London and was awarded a distinction on her thesis titled 'The safety and efficacy of botox use for the management of Bruxism & TMJ and Masseter Hypertrophy'.

Easier endo: my top five tips for quicker and better results during root canal treatment

Bob qualified from University College Cork dental school in 2003 and completed his endodontic training at Eastman in London in 2009, before gaining his MRD from the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh (RCSEd). He has worked as a specialist in endodontics in Ireland, England and Australia. He was a consultant in endodontics at the Edinburgh Dental Institute and in private practice at Edinburgh Dental Specialists. He was the training programme director for the DClinDent in Endodontology at the University of Edinburgh. He also acts as an examiner for the specialty exit examinations at RCSEd and is a key opinion leader for Dentsply. He is in private practice in Cork and regularly gives courses for the IDA.

Dr Joe Hennessy



Orthodontics: cases to avoid in general practice

Joe qualified with a first class honours degree from Trinity College in 2008. He worked as a general dentist, junior house officer, senior house officer and community dentist in Ireland and the UK, prior to returning to Trinity to complete a three-year doctorate in orthodontics. He has completed his membership exams in the RCS of Edinburgh (RCSEd) and fellowship exams in the RCSI. He shares his clinical time between his private orthodontic practices in Dundrum and Harcourt Street, while also treating public patients in Dublin's Regional Orthodontic Unit. He is an orthodontic supervisor at the Dublin Dental University Hospital, and is on the board of the dental faculty of the RCSI and the *International Journal of Aligner Orthodontics*. He has lectured internationally about, and has multiple published research papers on, adolescent and adult orthodontics.

Avoiding complaints/litigation

Martin qualified from Edinburgh and his career has included general practice, hospital and specialist referral service posts, and further studies leading to a master's degree, registration as a specialist in paediatric dentistry, qualifications in health service management, and legal scholarship examinations in the Faculty of Advocates. Martin has been involved in clinical guidance development for SIGN and SDCEP, and prior to joining Dental Protection as Dento-legal Consultant in 2011, he was assistant clinical director with NHS Lothian. He is currently Dental Protection's Head of Dental Services for Ireland. He presents regularly on a range of dento-legal topics, with a particular interest in communication, consent, and risk management.
