Endodontics: Managing challenging root canal anatomy*

Half-day course

Derek spent the last five years as a faculty member, Endodontic Department, UNC, Chapel Hill, US.*

This half-day course is aimed at general practitioners and those with an interest in endodontics. The aim is to improve the standard of endodontics for the participants by means of practical hands-on instruction. By the end of this half-day hands-on course, participants should be able to:

- negotiate constricted canals to length in a safe manner;
- understand the relationship between hand files and rotary files in shaping procedures;
- shape a constricted canal to length using a combination of hand and rotary files;
- irrigate effectively and safely using appropriate tools; and,
- direct files into canal orifices and dividing systems in a systematic manner.

April 2015 saw the introduction of a new



Code of Practice in Infection Prevention and Control by the Irish Dental Council. With this in mind, the IDA is offering practical hands-on infection control workshops for all dental team members (team members must be accompanied by a dentist). With support from Henry Schein, a full decontamination room/area will be *in situ* at IDENEX and delegates will be walked through the entire process. A detailed explanation will be provided of good practice in equipment layout in the decontamination area, with guidance on testing and essential documentation, all linked with the new Code. It is the responsibility of all dental practitioners to ensure that their surgery is compliant with the new Code of Practice.
