Periodontal instrumentation

Dr Richard Lee Kin

MAX 10 PEOPLE

Richard is a periodontist and owner of the Mint Clinic on Leeson St. His practice is limited to periodontology and dental implantology, with a particular interest in microvascular surgery. This course will cover practical and evidence-based guidelines on the efficient and effective use of ultrasonic devices for scaling, root debridement and biofilm removal.

Course objectives:

- to have an understanding of ultrasonic technology and how to optimise the function of the equipment; and,
- to understand how to select ultrasonic inserts depending on the type of deposits and the tooth surface involved to achieve the best clinical outcome.

Kevin specialises in prosthodontics and restorative dentistry. - how to establish proper contact points and emergence profile easily, quickly and predictably; and,
- restoration of the endodontically treated tooth.

He was editor of the *British Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery* from 1996 to 1997, and has been the editor of the *Journal of the Irish Dental Association* since 2005.

Hari is a consultant in anaesthesia and pain medicine at the Mater Misericordiae University Hospital Dublin. His current work involves the development of multidisciplinary pain management services and interventional therapies, including neuromodulation of the dorsal root ganglion. He is a member of the World Institute of Pain and a Fellow of Interventional Pain Practice (FIPP) and of the Faculty of Pain Medicine, College of Anaesthetists of Ireland (FPMCAI).



Radiographic diagnosis of maxillofacial lesions

Suk is a consultant in dental and maxillofacial radiology at Guy's Hospital and King's College Hospital in London. She qualified at Manchester Dental School in 1987, and carried out her specialist training in dental radiology at Guy's. For over two decades, Suk has taught dental radiology at under- and postgraduate level at a number of dental schools. She has just launched the PostGraduate Certificate in Dental CBCT Radiological Interpretation at King's College. Suk is the current President of the British Society of Dental and Maxillofacial Radiology.
