Course outline

This course will provide a hands-on tutorial on preparation design in fixed prosthodontics. The full-day course will consist of practical demonstrations of preparation techniques and designs, involving live demos and delegate participation using electric micro-motors on phantom head models. In addition, there will be informal mini-lectures accompanying each segment to try and explain the principles and techniques involved in tooth preparation. At all stages the goal will be to pass on as much practical and useful information to delegates as possible in order to benefit their everyday practice.

The main areas to be covered in this programme will be classic principles and modern adaptations of full-coverage restorations.

Course objectives

The main objectives are:

- classic and modern principles of tooth preparation;
- practical and useful information for everyday clinical use in fixed prosthodontics;
- a combination of hands-on and informal didactic discussions to add to existing clinical knowledge; and,
- increased confidence in material selection and preparation design.
