
CANCELLATION POLICY

Dr Caroline McCarthy



After qualifying with honours from University College Cork in 2009, Caroline went on to spend two years working in private practice in Kent in the UK. Dr Mary O'Dea



BDS (NUI) MClinDent in Periodontology UCL

Mary graduated from University College Cork in 1993 with a Bachelor of Dental Surgery Degree. She worked in private practice in London for seven years and attended many courses relating to general dentistry during her time there,

before returning to Cork in 2000. Mary practised as an associate dentist before setting up her own practice in 2002. After gaining a wide range of experience as a general dentist for 11 years, Mary commenced three years of full-time specialist training in periodontology and implant dentistry at the UCL Eastman Dental Institute, London, in 2004. This qualification involved clinical training and a research thesis on the genetic heritability of periodontal disease due to neutrophil dysfunction.
